Located on the main floor of the Texas Heart Institute at St. Luke's Episcopal Hospital—The Denton A. Cooley Building, The Wallace D. Wilson Museum covers the development of all key supporting services at the Institute and demonstrates the advances in technology achieved over the years. Visitors have access to interactive computers and some of Dr. Cooley's personal mementos and awards are displayed as well.

There is also a special art exhibit entitled *Celebration of Hearts*. Distinguished individuals worldwide have donated and sometimes created their interpretations of hearts. The stunning display, the brainchild of Houston's own Warner Roberts, features more than 130 items.

I think you learn every day. I certainly did by observing the medical history of the Texas Heart Institute. Without you, I wouldn't be here today.

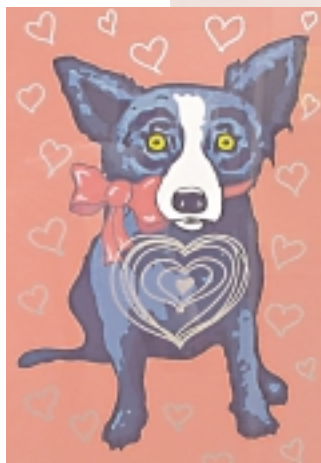
This exhibit doesn't skip a beat.
